Legacy: For Such a Time as This

START TALKING - Find conversations starters for the group or with a friend.

As a child, were there any celebrities that you tried to be like and why?
In your faith journey, who were the people that impacted you? How did they do this?

KEEP READING - Read the Scripture and ask a question to get the group thinking.

Esther 4:10-14 and Esther 9:26-28

Joseph shared how Esther and Mordecai model aspects of what it looks like to leave a Godly legacy. Legacy is about influencing the people around you and the next generation for Jesus.

- What stands out to you from the scriptures you read?
- What are some key things that Esther and Mordecai did that left a legacy?
- How did Jesus leave a legacy with his disciples and followers?

KEEP TALKING - Choose questions to create openness.

Joseph shared 5 characteristics of people who leave a Godly legacy. They were:

- 1) They live totally for Jesus (Esther 2:5-6)
- 2) They are devoted to prayer and fasting (Esther 4:16)
- 3) They take risks (Esther 4:11-16)
- 4) They know God's WHY for their lives (Esther 4:14)
- 5) They think generationally and invest in the next generation (Esther 2:7)

- Which of these characteristics stands out to you and why?
- Which one do you demonstrate well and which one do you need to grow in?
- What does it look like for you to influence the next generation for Jesus and pass on a Godly legacy?
- Is there anything you can learn from those who influenced you in your faith Journey? How could you put this into practice and be that person for someone else.

KEEP MOVING/GOING -Commit to a step and live it out this week.

What can you do to leave a legacy of others who have been impacted by you, for Jesus? Is there someone that you could intentionally come beside and disciple?
