START TALKING - Find conversations starters for the group or with a friend.

KEEP READING - Read the Scripture and ask a question to get the group thinking.

- If you were to pass on one thing Jesus said to someone who needed encouragement, what would it be and why?

KEEP TALKING - Choose questions to create openness.

Read Matthew 10:32 - 39

In this passage Jesus says some really hard things that we can find difficult to understand. Pastor Carl took some time to unpack this passage and we encourage you to listen to it mylgcc.com/redletters. Ultimately Jesus wants us to know that when we have Jesus, we have everything however, we can spend our lives accumulating much and not have Jesus and we don't really have anything. When we put him first, above everything, we can expect two things:
